The Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network Advisory Committee submitted a request for proposals (RFP) in March to replace the networking equipment throughout the region. The networking equipment is what allows connectivity between the different Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) and the hosts. This equipment consists of configured routers at every site that are capable of making decisions based on service availability.

The Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network has a primary virtual private network, and utilizes the PanCOM microwave network as a redundant solution. In the event that the primary network becomes non-functional, the backup network will take over to deliver the calls. The networking equipment will be capable of this, as well as allowing certain firewall access and security features.

The Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network Subcommittee will review and score the proposals prior to the Advisory Committee meeting, and provide a provisional recommendation based on funding availability from the Commission on State Emergency Communications.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the 9-1-1 Advisory Committee make a provisional selection and recommendation based on state funding availability.

TCOLE Training Cycle

Telecommunicators are required to obtain 20 hours of continuing education each TCOLE cycle. The current cycle began September 1st, 2023. Each person can check their own hours on the TCOLE website.

	Quarterly Performance Report - FY24-Q1

As stipulated in the agreement between Panhandle Regional Planning Commission and the Commission on State Emergency Communications (CSEC), the Panhandle 9-1-1 Network must establish and accomplish certain goals and objectives. In order to check progress throughout the year, we are required to submit to CSEC a quarterly performance report that includes 9-1-1 call volumes, monitoring results, network outage reports, system testing, and the status of equipment replacement. The following items make up the key points of the FY24 Q2 performance report covering December, January, and February.

- There were 23,887 9-1-1 calls received from the 21 regional call centers of with 15,556 being wireless (65.1 percent).
- Staff monitored Public Service Answering Points (PSAPs) 19 times with no findings.
- PSAP staff and PRPC staff performed 2,697 Network test calls.
- There were nine outages during this quarter.
- The region received 1,697 text messages during this period, with the vast majority as test texts.
